## Abram Lesson Questions

### BIBLE STORY QUESTIONS

- Hard  After the victory in battle Abram went to see Melchizedek king of Salem. The Bible says that Melchizedek was not only king but what? *(Priest of God Most High)*
- Hard  Through Melchizedek, Abram gave an offering in thanks to God. How much did Abram give?  
*He gave one tenth of all the riches.*
- Easy  After this, one night God took Abram out into the night. God promised Abram that He would make his descendants as numerous as what? *The stars in the heavens.*
- Hard  The Bible says in Hebrews 11:1: Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not **(what)**? *Seen*
- Easy  While Abram lived he never saw all of his descendants yet he believed God. That is why we call him a man of **(what)**? *faith*
